Sometime ago I wrote to you with details of a serious problem in Australia regarding the registration of non purebred dogs as Irish Wolfhounds. The response at that time was that you do not interfere in another kennel body's business but asked to be kept informed.

So, for your information, the attached is an advertisement which is going in Dog News Australia, which sets out very clearly the problem and the worldwide concern which it has engendered.

As a KC member, I find it hard to justify the KC's position when challenged by other Wolfhound owners. I believe the IKC is taking an interest so perhaps you could rethink your response. After all, if this can be done with one breed, it can be done with any breed and so ultimately will do away with Kennel Clubs worldwide, there being no longer any point in anyone saying they maintain a purebred register.
